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
Year 2

What have we been up to in Year 2?



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General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) What does it mean for parents at Lent Rise?

You may have heard of the GDPR, a piece of legislation that comes into force this month that is changing the way that organisations collect and manage the personal data they hold about people; in the case of schools, our pupils, parents, contacts and staff. As you can imagine Schools hold a huge amount of records, data and documents and this has been a major project for our admin and leadership teams.

We have been busy over the last few months preparing for GDPR. Parents with children in EYs, Yrs 4 and 5 will have received a data update form and we are rolling this form out to each year band (excluding Year 6) over the next few weeks. This form enables us to ensure that the data we currently hold is correct and a form must be returned by every child! The PTA have also been in contact with parents on their mailing list.

We'll also be updating our privacy policy and data protection policy and we will be writing to individual groups of parents where it is necessary for us to pass data on or store it in a different way. We'll also be introducing exciting new ways for parents to update their own information electronically.

Some things will also change on a day-to-day basis:

- Teachers will no longer be able to email parents directly and we would ask that any queries and replies come through the school office address office@lentrise.bucks.sch.uk.
- We will also no longer be able to give our class lists of first names for birthday invites or Christmas cards but if these are left blank we will hand them out to every child in the class.
- As a school we will be USB stick free children will not be able to bring homework in on USB sticks but if you can't print at home you will be able to email homework in to the school office.

As we continue through this process other things may change and we'll try and keep parents informed about this.

Those parents who have started their own social media groups (such as year-band Whatsapp groups) may also need to think about the GDPR, if you are sharing personal information. We'd also like to remind parents who use these groups that commenting about individual children or staff causes a huge amount of distress and will be treated very seriously by the school.



Whilst this process involves a lot of preparation for us we hope it will help us to work better and deliver a more efficient service to our pupils, parents and staff and ensure continued high standards of data security.
