Finance Plan Summary

The school's main source of income is the EFA funding. Other income includes Pupil Premium, SEN income, lettings and other revenue grants. The plan is based on assumptions that are reviewed by the then governing body at the budgeted setting phase to ensure they are realistic and consistent.

We aim to run a balanced budget, although some years might produce a small surplus and other years a small deficit. The governing body meet regularly to monitor the financial position and ensure we are on target to have balanced budget over the course of a 5 year plan. Some items on the school development plan might need to be funded from sources other than detailed above. The extent that these can be achieved is based on the assumption that these funds will be made available to us either through grants from the EFA, other sources, or through the parent body.
