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## Attendance

### Attendance and Punctuality

As parents you have a legal responsibility to make sure that your child attends school every day. If your child is going to be absent from school please contact the school office on the <u>first day</u> of their absence. This is important, as we will be contacting parents if a child is not at school and no reason has been given. Regular attendance and punctuality is fundamental to enabling your child to achieve the highest levels of attainment. We ensure <u>all</u> children are aware of the importance of attendance and punctuality.

The attendance target for this school year <u>is 97%.</u> We expect <u>ALL</u> children to achieve this. This area is a key priority for us to ensure each child receives a full education.

We will work with other agencies to support families to achieve this.

## If your child is unwell

If your child is <u>too</u> unwell to come to school, or has a medical appointment, please contact the school office and soon as possible. To help you, the NHS has compiled a list of guidelines about how long children should be kept off school when they have a common illness.

#### Lateness

Learning begins promptly at the beginning of the day with instructions and explanations and it is vital that your child does not miss this part of the day. We monitor lateness and send letters to parents whose children regularly arrive to school late.

### Authorised absence

Family holidays <u>should always</u> be taken <u>during the school holidays</u>, and we will only authorise absence in <u>very special circumstances</u>. On these occasions permission <u>must</u> be sought in advance from the Headteacher. Absence request forms are available from the school office or a letter should be written to the Headteacher.

#### Awards

We give out class of the week awards for attendance and termly awards for one class in each Key Stage. This year the class that has the highest attendance by July will receive a special prize from Mrs Watson.

## Managing screen time

Technology can be the cause of much stress at home, but it can be the source of wonder and delight too. So, how do we avoid the battles and enjoy the very best of what tech can offer?

Remember that not all screen time is equal. Spending hours flicking through Instagram does not have the same value as watching YouTube to help you learn a new skill. Try to understand what your child is doing with tech and the value that it can bring. Encourage your children to share what they are doing online and try to learn alongside them
