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#### The Kindness and Charity Club

The Kindness and Charity Club has been working hard this term to raise money and be kind to ourselves, others and the environment.

We started by sending 'Postcards of Kindness' to 19 care homes in the UK. This initiative was setup to combat loneliness and isolation felt by residents in care homes across the country. The postcards were well received and we have started to receive responses from some of the residents.





We then used scraps of fabric to create Organic Beeswax wraps. These reusable wraps can be used instead of cling film to wrap items of food in lunch boxes, fridges and cupboards. We also used tissue paper to make flowers. Four of the club attendees helped to sell these items at the Festival of Light event in the school playground and we raised £11.30.

In the 3<sup>rd</sup> week we continued the eco-friendly theme and used left over clay and flower seeds to create 'Seed Bombs' which we hope will flower in April.

In early November 'Lent Rise House' very kindly invited us to attend their 'Vintage & Craft Fair'. The residents of the home really enjoyed learning about the club and looking at all the things we'd made. We raised £21.65 at this event.

We helped the school to put together shoeboxes, wrapping the boxes and filling them with donations collected during the harvest festival. We'd like to offer a big thank you to everyone who donated shoeboxes, stationary, toys and toiletries for the Operation Christmas Child appeal. We successfully created 18 shoeboxes.





Over the last 3 weeks we have be busy recycling glass bottles, jars, baubles, card, wool and beads to create interesting Christmas decorations and cards. We will be selling these at the Christmas Fayre on 7<sup>th</sup> December, so visit our table and buy some unique gifts and decorations.

To date the club has raised a total of £32.95 which the children will be donating to the school to buy running vests and outside play equipment for the school.

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## Safeguarding and E safety

### Walking to and from School

As the dark evenings draws in we would like to remind parents that children in upper Key Stage 2 require written parental permission to walk to and from school unaccompanied. Children should be prompted to walk straight home and should wear clothing appropriate to the weather. Nationally, the number of road traffic accidents involving children rises steeply at this time of year, as poor weather conditions and low light make children crossing roads harder to spot. #### **Entrance gates**

Please can we remind parents of younger pupils, to ensure they enter the playground in the mornings and take the pupils to the entrance doors. Children in Early Years and Key Stage 1 should not be walking in from the gate unsupervised. Additionally we ask that parents stay well back from the entrance doors so that staff can monitor children entering. It can be distracting for staff to speak to parents in the mornings so there will be message pads available if you need to pass anything on, or alternatively please go to the school office where staff will be happy to help.

### Zig Zag lines

We would like to reiterate that parents must NEVER park on the zig zag lines outside the school. The lines are there to ensure that pedestrians crossing the road can get a clear view. They also help to keep the junction of the road clear and ensure that emergency vehicles could access the school quickly if needed. The following are not acceptable reasons to park on the zig zag lines:

- I'm running late
- I'll only be 5 minutes
- It's outside school hours
- I am dropping off to club
- There is nowhere to park
- Everyone else does it

Parking on the zig zag lines is selfish and puts children's safety at risk. Please don't do it! We would also like to reiterate the need for tolerance and courtesy if parking or traffic issues occur. Disagreements between parents can easily spill into the playground, so we would ask all parents to treat each other, our neighbours and staff with consideration and respect.

#### Mobile phones

Children may bring a mobile phone to school only if it is required to contact parents as part of walking to or from school unaccompanied. Children must switch their phones off and give them to their class teacher at the begining of the day, before collecting them at the end of the day. Children must not carry a mobile phone with them during the day.
